

A LEVEL MUSIC



A Level Music is a music course which follows on from the GCSE course in Music. It focuses on the fundamental musical skills of Performing, Composing and Listening





A Level music would suit any student who achieves a C or above in GCSE music, plays an instrument to Grade 2-3 standard or above and has some music theory and composition skills. The study

of A Level music will focus on Performance, Composing and several areas of study including; Vocal Music, Instrumental Music, Music for Film, Popular Music and Jazz, Fusions, and New Directions in Music. This is a course for musicians, performance

opportunities at the school are numerous, extra curricular activities are varied and relevant, and the course itself will be a wholesome and rewarding study with experienced and knowledgeable teachers.

A LEVEL MUSIC AT NEWMAN COLLEGE

A Level Music is the most respected music course available in Year 12 and 13. An A Level in music is highly respected qualification among Universities, especially Russell Group Universities, who understand that Music at this level is a serious study. The three strands of Music, which are performance (30%), composition (30%) and listening (40%), are further developed from the study from GCSE.



PERFORMANCE

Students will be expected to develop their instrumental skills in on of the instruments shown across the page. Lessons will be provided free of charge throughout the two year cause and students will work towards ABRSM Grades. Performance also forms 30% of the final mark for A Level music and students will perform both solo and as part of an ensemble

COMPOSING

Students will use the cutting edge software Logic X with Mac computers and a professional sound card. Use of the studio will also be available for A Level music students to work on their compositions. Students will be required to produce a variety of compositions taking inspiration from a variety of different musical styles



Here students will need to develop their listening skills through the study of various pieces of music and working through the ABRSM theory grades will greatly help their understanding of music theory and harmony. This part of the course will be assessed at the end of the course as a written exam.






