Key Tasks:

As a member of the Computing and Business department, the teacher will:

1. ensure improved examination results by:

- a) teaching Computing throughout KS3, KS4 and KS5
- c) providing a formative assessment of pupil progress at all stages;
- d) recording pupil progress clearly in the Teacher's Record Book:
- e) setting, marking and recording homework according to the Homework Timetable.
- f) attending regular department meetings as required;

- g) attending in-service courses;
- h) being available to cover for absent colleagues and set work where appropriate;
- i) maintaining exciting and stimulating displays for Computing
- j) working under the direction of the Head of Computing & Business.

2. Provide an environment conducive to learning by:
