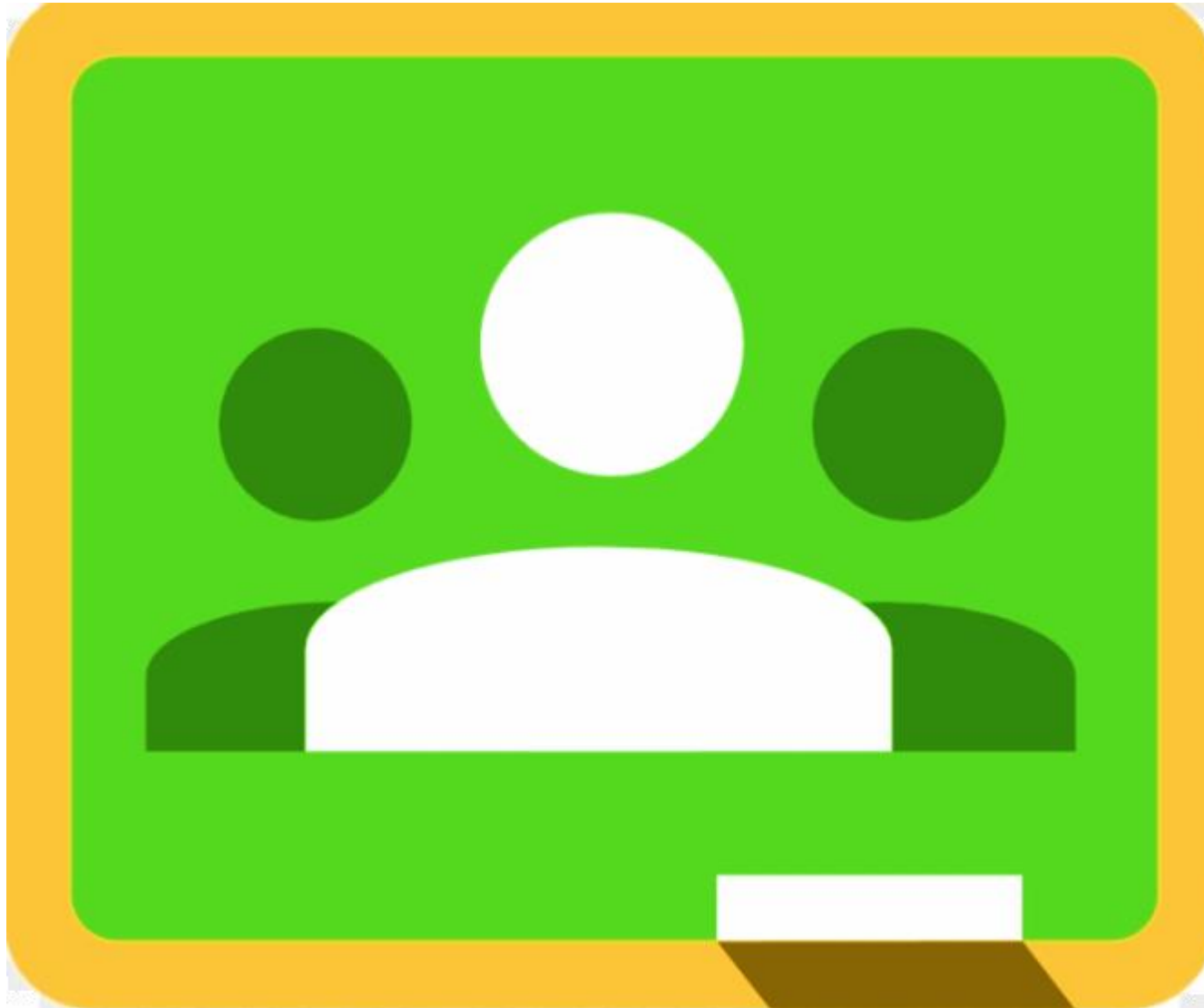
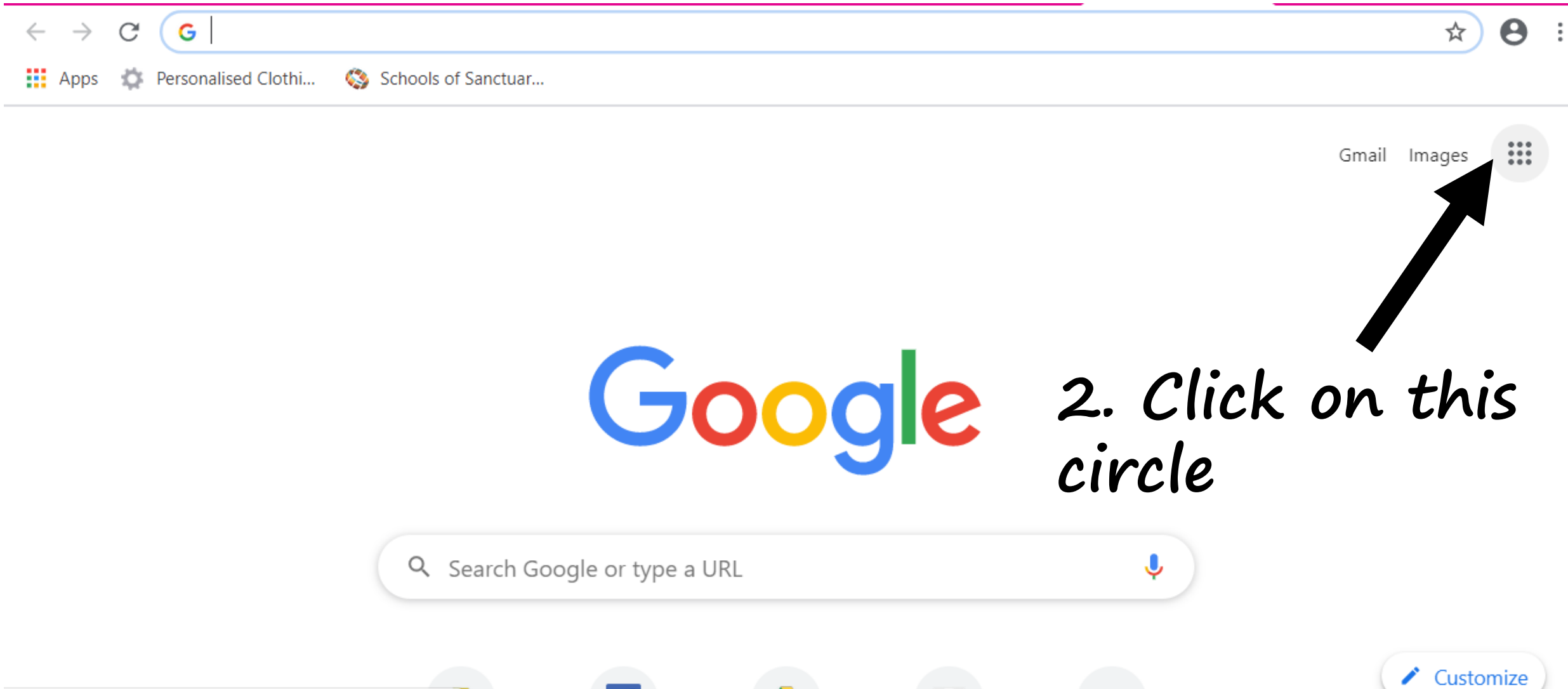


How to log on to Google Classroom

Search Google or type a URL

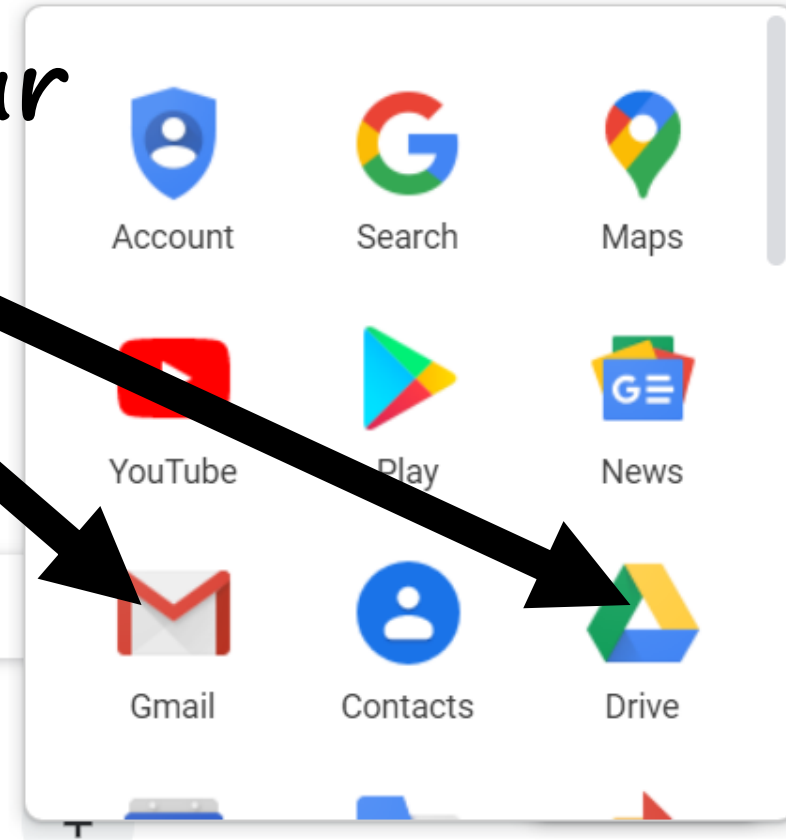



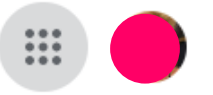

Sample Assessment Materials for Origins and Meaning

- (a) What is creation ex nihilo? [2]
- (a) What is the meaning of 'Imago Dei'? [2]
- (b) (i) Describe the teaching of the Catholic Church on the scientific theory of evolution. [5]
- (b) (ii) Choose one Christian charity and describe how its work reflects Catholic belief about the dignity of the human being. [5]
- (c) (i) Explain the attitudes of two different religions/religious traditions towards abortion. [8]
- (c) (ii) Explain from two different religions/religious traditions belief in humanity as created imago Dei [8]
