The Pupil Premium is allocated (by the Government) to help schools support children from low income families and children in care.

Newman Catholic College is located in a high area of poverty and many disadvantaged pupils face considerable barriers and challenges. These include :

- Limited or in some cases no place to study at home.
- Lack of experience of education and how to succeed.
- No history of post 16 education.
- Lack of access to a computer or internet.

Academic performance

The P8 of disadvantaged students in 2018 was -0.3 (MD) and 0.2 for the whole cohort.

The P8 of disadvantaged students in 2017 was -0.5 (MD) and -0.02 for the whole cohort

The P8 of disadvantaged students in 2016 was -0.5 (MD) and -0.05 for the whole cohort

There were 8 FTE in 2018-2019 of whom 2 were disadv. (8/3 in 2016-2017 and 17/4 in in 2015-2016

There were however 2 permanent exclusions both of whom were disadv.(cf. case study)

Evaluation of impact to date : September 2019

There has been some improvement in the academic progress of disadvantaged pupils in the past two years.

Notwithstanding the permanent exclusion of two disadvantaged students in 2017-2018 exclusion rates for disadvantaged students have declined in the last two years.

January 2019 census data shows that attendance rates for disadvantaged students is 2% below whole school
